Hamilton Sundstrand Demolition Makes Way for Green Community

Arvada, Colo. - Demolition, decommissioning and recycling operations have begun on the site of the former 500,000-square-foot Hamilton Sundstrand airplane parts manufacturing plant that closed in Adams County, Colo. after nearly a half-century of operation.

CMRA member, Recycled Materials Company, Inc. of Arvada, Colo., will decommission, decontaminate and demolish structures in the interest of redevelopment of the site. RMCI's role in this project includes:

- demolition and decommissioning of property buildings including basement structures, foundations slabs, building foundations and parking lots;
- abatement of building materials;
- recycling, transportation and disposal of waste materials in accordance with all applicable federal, state and local regulations;
- on-site recycling and re-use of clean asphalt and concrete for on-site backfill and specification material applications;
- site grading and revegetation of disturbed areas to a natural state.

The Sundstrand site will become 'Midtown' a 180-acre "green" urban village being developed by Carma. Approximately 1,200 homes are planned at the community and each will meet or exceed the standards of Built Green Colorado, the program of the Home Builders Association of Metro Denver that promotes energy efficiency, reduces pollution and water use, conserves resources and improves indoor air quality.

To date, RMCI has taken more than 25 million tons of concrete and asphalt out of the waste stream. With it, RMCI has created high-quality specification aggregate for re-use.
